

# Corsewall Lighthouse

If you've got the lighthouse bug, then you'll be pleased to hear that we are starting to locate some of the most unique properties to experience by the sea! Corsewall, on its ragged, rocky, clover-leaf point, was first lit in 1816.

Built, like so many in Scotland, by Robert Stevenson, it was intended to mark the Scottish side of the channel between the Rinn of Galloway and Northern Ireland. The lighthouse itself is out of bounds to guests, in case you might be tempted to play shadow puppets across the Irish Sea!

However, most of the action takes place in the solid, square house next door and, set back from the light house, there are a number of fantastic suites with views across the sea. In addition, Corsewall will be introducing 2 new suites later in the year.
